Trout in the Classroom (TIC)	2009	1300+	TIC is a hands-on, science-focused program that is a gateway stewardship experience as students learn about the connections between water resources, the environment, fish, and themselves.
Southcentral Outdoors For Youths	1992	10,250+	ACTU members introduce students to various recreational activities to encourage their interest in and enjoyment of the outdoors.
Latimore Creek Fishing Derby	2003	1,960+	ACTU hosts a free, annual derby where children can experience first-hand the fun of fishing with their families.
Youth Conservation Camps	1998	23	ACTU annually provides scholarships to local school students to attend a camp where they can develop an understanding of what conservation is about while enjoying nature and fly fishing.
